For those who took the journey weekly, I hope it was time well spent and that you've found your faith deepened by it just a bit. For those who may have missed the series – in part or in whole – please find below a verse by verse synopsis of our weekly teachings. Pastor Mark

We trust in God, whom Jesus called Abba, Father. In sovereign love God created the world good and makes everyone equally in God's image male and female, of every race and people, to live as one community.

Reflect: What does it mean to be "created in God's image?" What does it mean for ALL people to be created equal? How are we as Christians to respond and lean into our trust in our Creator, Abba Father while seeing and honoring God's image in us?

But we rebel against God; we hide from our Creator. Ignoring God's commandments, we violate the image of God in others and ourselves, accept lies as truth, exploit neighbor and nature, and threaten death to the planet entrusted to our care. We deserve God's condemnation. Yet...

Reflect: As the old hymn "Come Thou Font of Every Blessing" says, we are all "prone to wander." That is, we all understand the seriousness of sin – and our need for confession. And you don't need to wait until church on Sunday – you can turn your prayer to confession – and tune your heart to God's assurance of forgiveness – today.

Yet God acts with justice and mercy to redeem creation. In everlasting love, the God of Abraham and Sarah chose a covenant people to bless all families of the earth. Hearing their cry, God delivered the children of Israel from the house of bondage. Loving us still, God makes us heirs with Christ of the covenant.

Like a mother who will not forsake her nursing child, like a father who runs to welcome the prodigal home, God is faithful still.

Reflect: What is the best way that we may cause God to say of us: "I sure am one proud parent!" (I'll give you a hint: It starts with an "L" and it ends with an "OVE!")

We trust in God the Holy Spirit, everywhere the giver and re-newer of life. The Spirit justifies us by grace through faith, sets us free to accept ourselves and to love God and neighbor, and binds us together with all believers in the one body of Christ, the Church.

Reflect: How do we breathe in the Holy Spirit? How do we trust in the Holy Spirit in us to guide us as a church? How have you felt the presence and the power of the Spirit in your life and in the life of the Church? Where has it led you/us?

The same Spirit who inspired the prophets and apostles rules our faith and life in Christ through Scripture, engages us through the Word proclaimed, claims us in the waters of baptism, feeds us with the bread of life and the cup of salvation, and calls women and men to all ministries of the church.

Reflect: How has sharing in words, water, and wonderful meals brought you closer to others? How have the Word of God, the Waters of Baptism and the Wonderful Meal of Holy Communion brought you closer to God?

In a broken and fearful world the Spirit gives us courage to pray without ceasing, to witness among all peoples to Christ as Lord and Savior, to unmask idolatries in Church and culture, to hear the voices of peoples long silenced, and to work with others for justice, freedom, and peace. Reflect: What is justice? Is it just the bad guys getting punished and the good rewarded? Or does Biblical justice call us to seek something more - something deeper – something universally rewarding? How might the Church and every Christian – enflamed by the Holy Spirit – work to assure justice every day for all people?

In gratitude to God, empowered by the Spirit, we strive to serve Christ in our daily tasks and to live holy and joyful lives, even as we watch for God's new heaven and new earth, praying, "Come, Lord Jesus!"

Reflect: What are some ways that we strive to serve Christ every day - as people and as a small church? How do we perceive the "little things" in the grander scheme of God's BIG purposes for us and for the world?

With believers in every time and place, we rejoice that nothing in life or in death can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Reflect: Who has inspired you by living out the language of our faith? Pause, pray and give thanks today - for the saints who have shown you the way - and for just the opportunity every day to live into our wonderful life of faith as Christians.
